10:00 - 11:00	What makes an iconic news photo? What role does citizen journalism have in reporting the news? Find out with <b>Fiona Shields</b> , Picture Editor at the Guardian, who provides an insider's view on the pictures that make the headlines.
11:30 - 12:30	<b>Zed Nelson</b> discusses half a lifetime of photographing the same family and his other major projects including <i>Gun Nation</i> , an exploration of America's love affair with guns and <i>Love Me</i> , focusing on our obsession with cosmetic surgery.
1:00 - 2:00	Curator <b>Katie Barron</b> meets photographer <b>Chloe Dewe-Mathews</b> , whose most recent work, <i>Shot at Dawn</i> , a powerful tribute to allied troops who were shot for cowardice during WW1, transfers from the Tate to a shipping container on the Ipswich Waterfront.
2:30 - 3:30	<b>Julian Germain</b> returns to Ipswich to discuss his 25 year career as a social documentary photographer. One of the founders of the vernacular photography movement, Julian's work combines photography with popular culture and explores subjects as diverse as football, brass bands and ebay.
4:00 - 5:00	<b>George Georgiou</b> photographed his own city, London, from the top deck of a bus and is doing the same at PhotoEast 2016 in Ipswich. He will share his recent experience of Suffolk's county town and other less familiar urban landscapes.

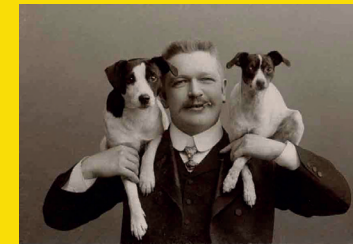

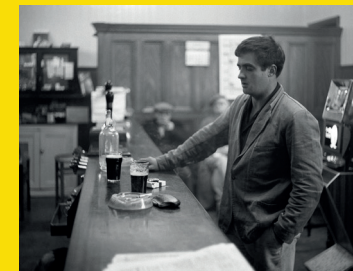
